## NORFOLK ON THE NATIONAL STAGE

The national Choice Neighborhoods Conference was held November 30-December 2, 2022, in Fort Myers, Florida, where representatives from communities that received a Choice Neighborhood Grant from the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) gathered to discuss best practices.

Nicole Brown, Senior Project Manager with People First, USI, presented the Norfolk's Landlord Incentive Program, an innovative way to engage landlords to accept rental payments using Housing Choice Vouchers (HCV).

Participants were wowed by this cutting-edge program and gave kudos to Nicole and the team for thinking "outside the box" in creating a way to increase the number of rentals available to those who use HCV to pay for housing.

### MORE THAN A HOME, A PLACE TO ASPIRE!

Do you remember the Willis Building at the corner of Brambleton Avenue and Church Street? Built in the mid-1980's, it was once the most prominent Black-owned business and office complex in downtown Norfolk.

It became necessary to tear down the building due to disrepair, but the legacy of a minority owned entity remains with Aspire, a new development underway in the location of the former Willis Building. Aspire will contain 85 apartment units; 21 units are for returning former Tidewater Gardens residents. The building will also house a full art studio.

Aspire is being developed by The Richman Group Development Corporation, a company committed to diversity; 54% of its staff are minorities, 46% are women. The developer will use local minority partners in the building process, keeping with the City of Norfolk's commitment to economic inclusion as part of the St. Paul's area transformation project.

Working in conjunction with The Richman Group is ISSA of Virginia, Inc., a 501 (C)(3) Community Development Corporation created by the Historic First Baptist Church, Norfolk. ISSA is engaged in economic development, education, community organizing and real estate development for lower income residents to enhance quality of life. ISSA means "Salvation, God Saves".

"The Richman Group is excited to partner with City of Norfolk, and many other stakeholders on a meaningful development that will hopefully be an exciting addition to the St. Paul's area of Norfolk" says Andre Blakley, President, TRG Community Development, an affiliate of The Richman group of Companies. "This deal would not be possible without our local partner, ISSA of Virginia, Inc., who also decided on the Aspire name for the project. As expressed by our partner, the Aspire represents a place where not only someone can lay their head but also lift up their head with various programming for residents, and a full Art Studio. We want our future residents to feel inspired by the development, but more importantly we hope this will be a community where individuals aspire to achieve a full and high quality of life. That is our collective mission."

Groundbreaking for Aspire will be in February.
