- There are currently 579 (94%) households and 1,549 individuals receiving family support services from People First, USI; we continue to support by providing family support case management services, economic mobility, education, and health and wellness.
- People First, empowered by USI, will host several Mobility Counseling sessions for the households returning to Kindred. Topics of discussion: understanding your lease, budgeting, and lease compliance, getting to know your new community, and what to do in the first thirty days of moving in; transportation will be provided.

Reunion at Kindred consists of apartment homes for seniors 55+.

Kindred community, and after the tour, the other three decided to make this their new home also! Residents will begin to move in to Reunion on November 20th!

TIDEWATER PARK ELEMENTARY

If you are wondering why Tidewater Park Elementary School looks vacant, it's because it is no longer being used as a school.

As result of the closing of the school, Ruffner Academy began operating this school year as a specialty program for grades 3-8. The new Compass Academy career and college pathways specialty program includes academic communities that offer rigorous instruction in engineering and sciences, fine and performing arts, technology, and service and leadership.



CALLING ALL ARTISTS!

The Artist Roster is a list of artists who pre-qualify to work with the City of Norfolk. It allows for a simplified, inclusive, equitable and transparent selection process for selecting artists and the commissioning of new, original, and site responsive public art. The Roster will become the main tool for choosing artists for the St Paul's public art projects.

This project is open to all artists over 18 years of age. The roster is open to individual artists and artist teams or artist collectives. Local artists of color or teams including local artists of color are especially welcome to apply. **Keep watching this space for more information coming soon!**
