- There are currently 580 (95%) households and 1,546 individuals receiving family support services from People First USI; we continue to support by providing family support case management services, economic mobility, education, and health and wellness.
- Families are continually assessed and linked to community partners that strengthen the families and continue to move them forward in reaching their goals.

LITERACY MATTERS

It is a well-documented fact that literacy is key to success in education, the workforce and life. People First, USI, will provide two literacy events that target children from kindergarten to middle school.

On October 30 they will host a "Trunk or Treat" event at the People First office on Tabb Street. In addition to traditional candy, each child 13 and younger will receive a book!



Parents and caregivers will have the chance to meet with education service providers and register for programs to enrich their child's reading experience.

In November, the focus will be on children 5-11 during the Little Literacy Lights event. Along with small games, beverages and snacks, youth will visit various stations, greeted by staff and hear story snippets. At the end, the young people will put together the story! Each child will receive a book light and books from the stations to take home as their own.

DHCD HOSTS VML TOUR!

The Department of Housing and Community Development for the City of Norfolk hosted a tour as part of the Virginia Municipal League's Mayor's Institute and Annual Conference.



The tour started with a bus ride through the St. Paul's area, where DCHD staff shared the area's history, strengths and opportunities. Participants then took a walking tour through the new Kindred neighborhood where VML leaders learned of new housing, best practices in community engagement and supportive services to families, and innovative flood mitigation efforts.
