In December, we bid a fond "thank you and farewell" to Danica Royster, co-chair of the St. Paul's area Advisory Committee (SPAC). Ms. Royster, who served as Norfolk City Council representative for Super Ward 7 and chose not to seek re-election, is stepping down as Chair of SPAC but will continue her involvement as a private citizen, appointed by Mayor Kenneth Alexander.

As Chair since 2021, Royster worked tirelessly to revitalize the St. Paul's area, focusing on leadership and collaboration with residents, City Council, and key stakeholders. She led a dedicated group of 17 citizens, always putting people first and ensuring that residents had access to vital services like housing, education, employment, and health care.

Royster was deeply involved in community activities, from job fairs to public art projects, and played a key role in creating a workgroup focused on Youth and Violence Prevention Solutions, which initiated the conversation that resulted in an RFP being issued by the City to bring a "credible messenger"



program to our area. She and co-chair Councilman John Paige also championed economic diversity in contracting, advocating for equitable opportunities for minority- and women-owned businesses.

ASPIRE GRAND OPENING



December 17th was an unseasonably warm day, perfect for the ribbon cutting ceremony marking the official opening of Aspire at Church Street apartments. Attendees were serenaded by the soulful voices of the Ready Academy Christian School chorus and city and state representatives made remarks.

The highlight of the ceremony was the \$20,000 investment in the ASPIRE Scholarship Fund, presented by the Richman Group, developers of the project. This scholarship will provide tuition support at 2 and 4-year colleges and trade schools for graduating high school students in the City of Norfolk.

The ASPIRE Scholarship Fund will be managed by ISSA of Virginia, Inc., a non-profit community development corporation (CDC) affiliated with First Baptist Church, Bute Street. ISSA of Virginia is responsible for defining the eligibility criteria and overseeing the application process for the scholarship.
